#### HEAR IT, FEEL IT, LIVE IT, SHARE IT - GOD'S LOVE

Dear siblings in Christ,

On Pentecost, we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit on the apostles. We celebrate it as the beginning of the Church, a celebration of how God calls us and equips us and sends us to share the good news of Jesus with the whole world! And one of the main symbols that we use for Pentecost, and for the Holy Spirit, is fire. Fire has so many uses, and is one of the most important inventions that humanity has ever made. And as a symbol, fire can remind us of so many important things about the Spirit.

Fire is life-giving. Think about your food, for example. Cooked food is easier to digest, it's safer for you, and most of the time it's a lot better tasting! Fire keeps us warm on winter nights, fighting off the cold with its glowing embers; or with furnaces that push heated air into our homes throughout the cold season. Anyone who has ever gone camping, or held a bonfire, or sat around a fire pit, knows that fire draws us together. It brings out stories and conversations. Fire is a centerpiece for human interaction. Fire is life-giving.

And fire is also destructive. Wildfires in California and Australia have been in the news over the years, burning down tens of thousands of acres and consuming homes, businesses, farms, and living things in their wake. House fires destroy memories and lives and cause trauma to those who experience them. The sight of a plume of smoke while we're driving down a country road immediately draws the question of "is that fire intentional, or do I need to call the fire department?" Fire can be destructive.

But sometimes, fire's destructive capacity is also what makes it life-giving. Whole ecosystems rely on fire to replenish, to open up seeds, to bring about the next generation of living things. The soils of the Great Plains are so rich because of millennia of wildfires turning vegetation into nutrients for the earth. Prairie restoration projects use fire to cull invasive species and help establish native ones. Fire removes what was old only to replace it with something new.

Pentecost is the story of the coming of the Holy Spirit, and that is a wonderful thing. But the rest of the book of Acts, where that story is found, is basically a story of an uncontrolled fire. The Spirit blows where it will, without regard to what we think is proper or respectable or good. The Spirit fell on Gentiles when the Church was still convinced everyone needed to follow Jewish Law to be saved. The Spirit pushed Philip to proclaim to a eunuch (!) whom he baptizes! The Spirit is constantly moving the church in directions that, if it were up to human beings, would be seen as simply destructive—erasing the character of the Church, welcoming people in the wrong way, being too ready to affirm the humanity of those on the margins. The disruptive and destructive nature of the Spirit is the lesson we should be taking from the story of Pentecost and the book of Acts in general.

So what disruptive or destructive thing is the Spirit doing now, here at Our Savior's? What new directions are we being pulled in? How are we called to follow where the Spirit is already going? It's one of those things that none of us can predict, but we can certainly discover it together. Perhaps that newness, that disruption, that fire, is to be found in how we worship, or how we teach children, or how we engage with the community, or how we model the kingdom for others. I encourage each of y'all, this summer, to take a look at the fire of the Holy Spirit, and ask, "what wild new thing are you doing with us today?"

In Christ, Pastor Lucas God calls us to the waters of baptism, and as we enter the months ahead, keep in mind the following dates that are open for baptisms.

#### **EVER PONDER YOUR LEGACY?**

Your legacy is how you want to be remembered after your life has passed. There is a book of remembrance in the narthex of our church. In it are the members of Our Savior's who have made the Our Savior's Lutheran Church Endowment Fund (O.S.E.F.) part of their legacy.

The O.S.E.F. was established and approved by the congregation on January 28th,1996.

All bequests and donations to the O.S.E.F. are invested and only the income from the investments are disbursed every year with the congregation's approval at the Annual Meeting.

As its preamble states:

WHEREAS Christian Stewardship involves the faithful management of all the gifts that God has given to humankind - the created world, the Gospel, life, time, abilities, money, including accumulated, inherited and appreciated resources, and WHEREAS the Scriptural principle of proportionate giving, the return to the Lord a portion of the gifts God has first given to his beloved children, is both a privilege and an appropriate response in all times and circumstances, and WHEREAS, Christians can give to the work of the church through bequests in wills, assignment of life insurance, charitable gift annuities, charitable remainder and other trusts, assignment of certificates of deposit, and transfers of property (cash, securities, bonds, real estate), and WHEREAS, it is the desire of Our Savior's Lutheran Church to encourage, receive and administer these gifts in a manner consistent with the loyalty and devotion to our Lord as expressed by the donors and in accord with the policies of this congregation....

The purpose of the O.S.E.F. is to enhance our churches outreach ministry. This includes educational scholarships, agencies ministering to adults/families in need, grants to ELCA schools, colleges, and seminaries, and grants through the Synod and ELCA for various ministries. (A full listing appears in the O.S.E.F. bylaws.) No income from the fund can be used for budgetary expenses. Income disbursed follows the guidelines as set forth in the endowment fund bylaws.

This article is intended to inform you as to the purpose of O.S.E.F.
